Our annual Room in Your Heart flyer is used as an adoption flyer. We don't put animals in the program lightly, and, once they are in, it is our goal that they are adopted before next year's flyer comes out.

We had nine placements from last year's flyer. Out of the twelve pets in last year's flyer, we have only three that are reappearing in this year's flyer. That is great, but it is even more of a priority that we find these three pets homes this year.

It continues to be a mystery to us why some animals have such a hard time finding homes. That goes for our repeat cats this year: Teddy & Latches (see inside). They have no health problems. They are among our most entertaining cats. They are beautiful and we don't know why they get overlooked.

Regardless of how long it takes, we will keep looking for homes for them. We feel lucky to have so many caring supporters who allow us to keep our animals until suitable homes are found. We couldn't do this without your generosity! Your donations are crucial and very much appreciated, and we hope you will continue your support so we can help more animals.




TEDDY AND LATCHES

- We provide full veterinary care for all animals before placement, including treating injuries or illnesses, testing for communicable diseases (including heartworm and tick-borne diseases in dogs and Feline Leukemia, FIP, and FIV in cats), testing for and treating internal and external parasites, and spaying or neutering.
- We do not import animals from out of state; we focus on dogs and cats in need in our local community.
- We support you with any problems you may have for the life of the pet.
- We will take back any pet without question, regardless of how long the pet has been in the adoptive home. We are here for an animal's entire life—no matter what.
